We have all heard about the Backpacks for Kids food program that the Great Falls Food Bank provides to our local elementary schools.

Did you know that Jim and Ember Woods have been faithful volunteers since the program began? At the start of the 2023-2024 school year Ember asked a group of our church members if we would join her in fillings lunch bags for the kids.

Since that time Sunrise has provided a core team of volunteers that meet every Monday at the food bank. There are six of us that regularly take turns working. We do two hours a week (average 8 laborhours a week). We fill about 500 lunch bags in that two hours. The food bank gives about 900 lunches to the schools every week.

Next school year they are planning to give lunches to the middle schools also because hunger doesn't stop at 6th grade.

Our Adult Bible Study group meets the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of the month at 10 am. Anyone is welcome to join!


